## **Drama**

### Sounds of Shakespeare Workshop

On Monday 6 October local theatre company c21 came to educate and entertain CCB's GCSE drama students in their Sounds of Shakespeare Workshop. The focus of the Company was on the language of Shakespeare, the rhythm, the iambic pentameter and the drama of lines when brought to life in performance. The actors from c21 performed scenes from *Romeo and Juliet*, *Macbeth*, *The Tempest* and *Othello*. The year 11 and 12 boys appreciated the opportunity to gain insight into how to deliver the language of Shakespeare effectively and gained a greater understanding of the meaning that lies underneath the discourse. Several boys volunteered to take part in the practical aspects of the workshop – Tom Phillips and Ross Taylor (year 12) brought to life the opening Prologue of *Romeo & Juliet* through the use of mime.

### Antigone Trip

On Friday 24 October nearly 40 students attended a special student performance of a new version of Greek classic *Antigone* (Sophocles) written by local playwright Owen McCafferty and presented by local company Prime Cut. It was a compelling experience for our GCSE and A Level drama students to witness a timeless Greek masterpiece translated into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and placed in a local context. This production, part of the Belfast Festival at Queen's, provided our A Level Drama students with the opportunity to write their evaluative coursework on a live play they have attended, focusing on various aspects such as set, staging, costume and lighting. Our GCSE students relished the opportunity to see live theatre and gained insight into the various aspects of performance, direction and technical effects. An experience beyond measure.

### Not About Heroes

It was a great pleasure to welcome Dennis Silk to the College on 10 November. Born in California, educated at Christ's Hospital & Sidney Sussex, Cambridge, Warden of Radley College for 26 years, first-class cricket for Somerset & represented the MCC.

Dennis Silk came to the College to talk about his friendship with the cricket-loving poet Siegfried Sassoon in the 1950s and, of course, to provide some insight into the War Poets. Our Sixth Form students responded well to his avuncular presence and his intimate knowledge of Sassoon's poetry.

The play, *Not About Heroes*, explores the friendship of Wilfred Owen and Siegfried Sassoon through a series of flashbacks. The two actors are required to hold the stage for two hours with minimal use of props: a powerful effect is achieved by the beauty of Owen's and Sassoon's words juxtaposing with the horror and the pity of war.

## House Drama

The Annual House Drama Competition took place on Friday 14 November. All eight houses participated with palpable enthusiasm. The event was well supported with a full house. £360 was raised for charity to be shared between Jengana and Children in Need.

### NI Youth Forum

The NI Youth Forum is a lobbying organisation for young people between the ages of 14 and 25. ### Future Entrepreneurs

Young Enterprise students competed against nine schools in a Trade Fair on Saturday 21 February in Conswater Shopping Centre. The company, self-named, "Environ-men" sold 17 trees complete with a free love poem and a chocolate dipped strawberry.

The company were awarded a Special Prize, one that the Judges hadn't anticipated awarding; in awarding the certificates the judges stated that, *"Enviro-men from Campbell College should be highly commended. ## Duke of Edinburgh

### Bronze Award

There were 35 boys this year that signed up for the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award at CCB. They all completed training both inside school and during their practice expedition in May 2009. For their practice expedition the boys enjoyed a full day's hike along the North Down Coastal path; they carried their full packs and due to very bad weather conditions, the boys ended up extremely wet, cold and tired. Nevertheless, they struggled on through and successfully completed their hike. They had the opportunity to practice putting up their tents, cook on their stoves and practise navigation skills.

On their final expedition, the boys completed a two day walk and overnight stay in the low-lying Mourne Mountain area. All groups successfully completed their routes and made it home safely: all had projects to carry out whilst they were on expedition and each group had an 'aim'. One group, for example, looked at, 'tourism' in the area and another used 'litter' as their theme, collecting rubbish on their way. Each group then had to give a presentation on their project upon their return.

This Award Scheme requires determination, enthusiasm and dedication as the participants are required to complete another three areas as well as the expeditions. They have to complete the 'physical education', 'skill' and 'service' sections throughout the year. All boys at CCB who completed their Bronze Award should be proud of their achievement and I would encourage them to move on to Silver. Well done! *W Pollock*

### Silver Award

There are currently 22 year 12 boys completing the Silver Award. This began in October 2007 when they received their Record Packs and began completing the Physical, Skill and Service activities. More recently the boys have undergone the necessary expedition training, revising topics such as Map Skills & Compass Work, Navigation, Campcraft and The Country Code.

This training was put to the test during the Silver practice journey that took place over a weekend in April in the Antrim Hills. ## **Gold Award**

In September 2008 nine determined individuals signed up for the Gold Award. They are mostly direct entrants without the experience of the Bronze or Silver Award under their belts. They have tackled the challenges of the Gold Award with determination and enthusiasm.

Some have volunteered their time to coach badminton in their church, guide young Cub Scouts or raise money for Jengana. One of the reasons the award is so highly rated by employers is the dedication required to sustain the commitments they make for up to 18 months through other pressures such as exams and jobs. For the Gold Award the boys must also live away from home for 5 days with a peer group they don't know. Some have offered to help this summer with a Bible Week and Scout Camp. It is one of the elements of the award most enjoyed, and life changing for many participants.

Through the winter the boys came to regular training sessions after school to learn the basics of navigation and campcraft in preparation for their 4 day expedition. Their first practice was on a beautiful sunny February day on Slieve Croob, not the most challenging navigation, cooking and tent erecting proved more problematic. In early April they set off for 4 days in the Mournes, a new experience for most of them. They learnt the hard way; such as their good golfing waterproofs would have been a better choice than a thin yellow windsheeter; food is important, the more the better; teamwork and camaraderie pay off and it's always good to have a talented map reader. They had 2 glorious days in the high mountains when they all climbed Donard and helped clear invasive Rhododendron as part of their aim; it was surprising how satisfying they found uprooting large bushes in the name of conservation. They finished the 4<sup>th</sup> day in awful weather conditions, sensibly choosing to walk a low level route to Newcastle. All finished in good spirits and certainly felt they had been pushed both mentally and physically and with the knowledge that mums do an awful lot for them.

Their final assessed expedition is due to take place at the end of June 2009. Two groups will be hiking high and low through the Snowdonia National Park, North Wales. Their aims are to climb Snowdon and also cut down an invasion of spruce trees! Once completed most of the Gold group will be well on their way to finishing the award.
