Collectively, Team A displayed inspired team work to win Match 3 and finished in a very respectable fourth place overall in the Champion Unit competition.

Northern Ireland Cadet Military Skills Competition

Director's Notes: *South Pacific*

This is your opportunity to journey to the South Pacific via Campbell College. Allow yourself to be transported to a wistful, nostalgic place of incredible beauty. An island with two volcanoes, that seems to capture the soul of those who grace its shores. Michener describes its unending tranquillity perfectly in *The Tales of the South Pacific*:

I wish I could tell you about the South Pacific. The way it actually was. The endless ocean. The infinite specks of coral we called islands. Coconut palms nodding gracefully toward the ocean. Reefs upon which waves broke into spray, and inner lagoons, lovely beyond description. I wish I could tell you about the sweating jungle, the full moon rising behind the volcanoes, and the waiting. The waiting. The timeless, repetitive waiting. From James A Michener's Tales of the South Pacific

As the Americans attempt to breakthrough against the Japanese during the Second World War we see tensions arise that are at odds with the striking serenity of the island. Dickens eloquently describes such disharmony in 'A Tale of two Cities' when he writes, 'It was the best of times, it was the worst of times.' Solders risked their lives for others and displayed heroism in the face of great adversity.

There is displayed a distinct sense of community and conquests of love that struggle to supersede rising racial tensions and ignorant xenophobic views. I want to transport you to a different era, albeit one of questionable views; built mainly on ignorance and fear, but with an appreciation of the morality and deep seated goodness that existed. The mesmerising locals with their native charm and the mêlée of cultures pitted against the two love stories; one of which manages to overcome the strain of cultural diversity and the other which ends in death and devastation. I wanted to stress the growing independence of the women, whose efforts in war often go unacknowledged. I also wanted to express comedy through the Seabee's, and in particular Billis, to lighten the mood with their upbeat, cheeky and opportunistic ways. In addition, Commander George Brackett, slight in stature and eccentric is characterised by his jowl shaking and explosive temper.

It is my hope that you will be moved by the tenderness displayed between Liat and Cable and will appreciate the naivety of Nellie's love for the stoical Frenchman, Emile.

The music is inspirational and reflective of the mood and the moment with the score expressing the love, charm and melancholy of the tale. I hope that we can entertain you and 'make your dream come true.'

Finally, many thanks for the dedication of the production staff and musical directors who have given many hours and a great deal of expertise to this production.

Remembrance Service

Rupert Johnston, parent and OC delivered the following Address at the College Remembrance Service on Friday 11th November 2011.

“We are the dead. Short days ago we lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow...if ye break faith with us who die, we shall not sleep...”

In his poem John McCrea purports to speak on behalf of a unified dead who are urging a continuance of the Great War and a settling of scores. I do not presume to speak on behalf of the 228 Campbellians killed in 2 world wars, nor on behalf of the 11 Campbellians killed in the service of their country since 1945, or those killed before 1914, nor would I urge the continuance of any war. Although today we remember all those who have given their lives and especially Campbellians who have done so, I will speak about just one or two Campbellians with whom I have a personal connection and who I especially choose to remember this morning.

You'll forgive me if I address my remarks to the pupils here today - it's the matter of connecting with remembrance and what we, as Campbellians, might **choose** to remember that I want to try and address. I feel privileged to have been asked to address this service because Campbell is always at the heart of remembrance for me; it's the place that connects my military career, lifelong friendships and remembrance.

Perhaps I'm fortunate to be able to make these connections – I know it can be hard to connect with remembrance and with the war dead; sometimes it all seems a bit detached. It's hard to connect when casualty figures are in their millions – lists of name after name on walls in foreign lands – or more recently when it's an unfamiliar face on the evening news. It's easier to connect when it impacts closer to home, so let me try and give remembrance some context. 594 Campbellians fought in the first war (that's about two thirds of the total number of boys in Campbell today). Between them they received 147 decorations including a VC. 126 of these Campbellians were killed – 126 dead from this school in the Great War – that's about the equivalent of everyone who is in School House today being killed before the next rugby world cup (2015 in England) – all of School House.

Just over 1000 Campbellians fought in World War 2 and of these 102 died – that equates to all of today's Year 13 killed in war – I'll just let you connect with that for a moment – all of today's Year 13.

And since WW2 many Campbellians have maintained the tradition of service and 11 have given their lives and are also remembered in our new memorial at the back of the hall. In fact just about every generation who has passed through this school can connect on a personal level with a Campbellian life lost in conflict and your generation maybe already and almost certainly will be no different, I'm afraid to say.

All the casualties I refer to were Campbellians like you and I – and most of their faces look out at us today. That's why for me this particular service really allows a connection – as Campbellians we share a common bond with all of these men and through that we can connect – so at this school and in this hall, remembrance really means something for all of us.

To follow through this business of connection I want to speak briefly about the first generation of my family to come to Campbell. My grandfather Maurice was the youngest of three brothers. He was here at Campbell when he was told that one of his older brothers had been killed at the Battle of Cambrai. Maurice's older brothers were twins and both started Campbell before him in September 1908.

One of the twins, Philip, played in the 1913 – 14 1st XV and of this team 7 were killed in the Great War, including the Team Captain RC Whiteside who was killed by the German flying ace known as the Red Baron. Seven dead from the same close-knit team – I'll just let you connect with that for a moment – almost half the team. Philip was one of two from the team to survive but lose a brother to the war. Philip's twin brother Jim was drafted into the BEF towards the end of the war in August 1918 a few years after leaving Campbell. He arrived in the Hawke Battalion of the Royal Naval Division on 19 September 1918 and was killed at Cambrai on 08 Oct 1918 – that's just 19 days with his unit – he was 21 years old when he was killed. His picture is just there beside Ms Russell's classroom. 21 years old, (only 4 or 5 years older than most of you), a few years out of Campbell, and dead after 19 days. His story is not unusual for Campbellians of that generation. So today I also choose to remember Jim Johnston and I connect with him as a fellow Campbellian as much as a relation.

Closer still I choose today to remember my good friend and fellow Campbellian David Kelly. David and I started Campbell in September 1981 – he was a boarder in Alden's and I used to abuse his hospitality in his study, steal his toast at break-time and generally enjoy his company. We were both in the CCF and whilst I chose to enjoy the pleasures of the infantry David (perhaps wisely) chose the comfort of the REME mechanics shed. After leaving Campbell we both worked for a time in the same Belfast office sharing the train to work, sharing weekday lunchtime pints and weekend all-day pints. David subsequently followed me through Sandhurst and we served together with 1 R IRISH and at our Regimental Depot. David died as a result of conflict; he was a fellow Campbellian and a good friend – not every wound suffered in combat is a physical one, and the non-physical injuries can be just as damaging.

So today I also choose to remember David and the bond of friendship that we shared, which was forged here at Campbell. I also choose to remember all those who continue to carry the non-physical scars of serving their country.

So today we pay our respects to all those who have given their lives. But for me Campbell is at the heart of remembrance and my experience is really no different than any other generation of Campbellians in our connection with the dead. For you – and I'm mostly talking here to the young men in a Campbell uniform – if you might feel you can't really connect with remembrance, consider this; you **are** connected. As a Campbellian you're already connected to the 239 dead Campbellians who look out at us from these very walls and who we remember today. As a generation of Campbellians you are closely connected to each other and given this school's rich history of service it seems to me that you, like me, will have a personal connection with remembrance in the years ahead. I encourage you to ponder all of these connections; choose to connect and to remember at this special service and in keeping with our school motto...
