Careers Opportunities in Year 12 - 14

A number of events and opportunities are offered in the Easter Term to assist boys in making sound choices at Post-16 and Post-18 level, also helping them develop the skills to be successful in application and selection processes. I would particularly like to draw your attention to the following:

Centigrade is an online profiling service for Year 13 which can help match students to specific courses they are suited to and show interest in. This is available through the Careers Department and it is still possible to sign up.

Furthermore, we run two 'Assessment Centre' activities in both Year 12 and Year 13, which take students through a realistic selection process as used by a significant number of employers and helps them develop the skills required for success in application and interview. School Policies

There are also links to useful guidance for parents including our Pastoral Care Handbook and topics such as Electronic safety, Examination Access Arrangements, Attendance and Concussion.



School Attendance and Punctuality in the mornings

The school day officially starts at **8:40am** with tutor meetings. Although the vast majority of boys arrive on time, there are a minority who frequently arrive late. As lateness is recorded on your son's attendance profile and on any references we are required to provide, we would ask parents/guardians to ensure that your son arrives punctually.

The Department of Education now has full access to pupil attendance records and we would remind parents that their son should only be absent from school when absolutely unavoidable. On the first day of absence a message should be left on the College's absence line (02890 764101) and for absences more than one day, a note should be sent in with him on his return giving reasons for the absence. The Education Authority considers more than 10 days absence in an academic year to be unsatisfactory and requires attendance below 85% to be reported to Educational Welfare. We will write to parents at the end of each term when their son's attendance is below or approaching this level.

Requests for Absence during a School Term

We would request that holidays and personal appointments are booked outside the school calendar. If there are exceptional circumstances when you need to take your son out of school, a request should be made in writing and sent to the relevant Head of Year. Parents/Guardians should be aware such absences are recorded on attendance figures as 'unauthorised absence'.

Signing in and Out of School

Whilst we encourage medical and dental appointments to be made outside of school hours we understand that at times this is not always possible. If boys need to leave school during the day a note should be provided detailing the reason and times of the appointment. This should be signed by the tutor in the morning and then shown at Front of House when signing out. Boys will not be permitted to leave school unless a note is produced or a call is made to Front of House.

In recent weeks a number of boys have contacted home to ask parents to collect them early from school as they are unwell. **This should not be done.** The procedure is that boys should go to Matron who will then make an assessment and contact parents if necessary.

Security of belongings and Lost Property

Pupils are reminded that they must not bring expensive items into school as the security of their property remains their personal responsibility. All personal items must be clearly labeled so they can be returned to them if lost.



Lost Property is located in Longfield Pavilion. The store is open from 2.30pm – 4.00pm from Monday to Thursday to allow for the re-claiming of clothing and other items.

Year 14 Car Drivers

We would remind all Year 14 car drivers and potential car drivers that they **must** complete a registration form to allow them to drive and park in the school grounds. If boys need to exit the College during the day permission must be obtained from either a parent or a Head of Year and the driver must collect an exit slip from Front of House. Pupils may not carry passengers unless the necessary documentation has been obtained and approved by the College. If these procedures are not followed, the permission to drive on school grounds may be removed.

Please ensure that if your son drives to school that he has registered his car with us.

Appearance and Uniform

The College policy on Uniform and Appearance is available on our website and we would ask that pupils return to us in January clean shaven, in the full uniform and with hairstyles in line with expectations.

Items for collection from Front of House

In the event that your son may leave something at home which he will need during the school day, items may be left in Front of House for collection. **Unfortunately, due to the number in circulation, it is not possible to deliver items or messages to boys on an individual basis and we would ask that parents not make such requests.**
